Magnetic Resonance Imaging Services Contract Amendment

Revised recommendation: Authorize the Acting Director of Health Services to execute an amendment to an agreement with Insight Health Corporation, for the continued provision of magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) services to multiple Department of Health Services (DHS) facilities, effective upon execution, to extend the term for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2023, at a per-scan rate of \$369, and an estimated annual amount of \$6,536,837 plus a month-to-month estimated amount of \$69,800 for the Rancho Los Amigos National Rehabilitation Center (RLANRC) for an approximate period of six months during which the services at RLANRC will be brought in-house, with funding included in the Department's Fiscal Year 2018-19 Recommended Budget and to be requested in future fiscal years; and authorize the Acting Director to take the following related actions: **(Department of Health Services)** APPROVE (Continued from the meetings of 6-6-18 and 6-12-18)

Execute amendments to the agreement to comply with any American Medical Association revisions, Medicare and/or Medi-Cal program revisions and reimbursement directives, incorporate and/or revise certain non-substantive terms and conditions; ~~revise ground lease agreements' terms to accommodate fluctuations in service needs at the facilities; and~~

If necessary, terminate for convenience the MRI services at RLANRC with at least a 90-calendar-day notice and at all other DHS facilities with at least a 180-calendar-day notice, terminate the agreement in accordance with the termination provisions and upon termination, ...

Execute amendments to the ground lease agreements with Insight Health Corporation to extend the term of each agreement to be co-terminus with the provision of MRI Services at each DHS facility and revise the terms to accommodate fluctuations in service needs at the facilities, effective upon execution.

59-A. Opposing the Separation of Children and Families at the United States - Mexico Border

Recommendation as submitted by Supervisors Solis and Kuehl: Direct the Chief Executive Officer to send a five-signature letter to the Secretary of the United States Department of Homeland Security, the Senate and House Leadership and the Los Angeles County Congressional Delegation opposing the practice of separating children from their families and urging that no funding be approved for the prosecution of parents seeking asylum who arrive at the border with minor children; instruct the Director of Children and Family Services and the Acting Executive Director of the Office of Immigrant Affairs to report to County Counsel any children who were separated from their parents at the border, who could be in Los Angeles County foster care/relative care and, where possible, offer assistance in contacting Federal officials so that minors can be released into foster/relative care while their parents are in detention; and instruct the Acting Director of the Office of Immigrant Affairs, in coordination with County Counsel, to contact the United States Office of Refugee Resettlement and request permission to visit shelters operated by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, to offer assistance to any minors that could be released into the custody of relatives in Los Angeles County, through the Department of Children and Family Services.
