NUMBER OF MEMBERS*

Twenty, four nominated by each Supervisor. Ex officio nonvoting members: Deputies from the five Supervisorial Districts, Chief Executive Officer and the departments of Internal Services, Public Works, Auditor-Controller, Health Services, Sheriff, County Counsel, Community Development Commission, U.S. Small Business Administration and the State Department of General Services.

Each Supervisor may name one alternate for each district. The alternate may attend all meetings, but will have a vote only when he/she is replacing a designated Advisory Board member from that District.

QUALIFICATIONS

Each member shall reside in Los Angeles County and be a representative of the business community in Los Angeles County.

APPOINTMENT

By Board of Supervisors.

TERM OF OFFICE

Three years, from the appointment date.

COMPENSATION

None.

MEETINGS

Quarterly meetings shall be held in January, April, July and October at a location and time be announced five working days prior to the day of the meeting. Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time by the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or any two members. Any person calling such meeting shall give notice of the meeting pursuant to the requirements of the Brown Act.

Section 5.12.050 of the Los Angeles County Code provides that if any member (other than an ex officio member) fails to attend three consecutive meetings, unless excused by the members thereof, that member's office becomes vacant. The secretary shall so notify the appointing officer who shall immediately appoint a member to fill such vacancy.

DUTIES

Provide ongoing advice and support to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to help small business grow; and do business with Los Angeles County. In carrying out this mission, the advisory board shall monitor and evaluate progress in the implementation of the "Bold Steps Forward" recommendations adopted by the Board of Supervisors for improving the County's procurement practices and make recommendations relating to other issues that affect the small business community. The Commission shall provide a status report and make any recommendations to the Board of Supervisors at least once a year.

OATH

Not required.
