### **APPOINTMENT**

By Board of Supervisors

## **TERM OF OFFICE**

Four years, at the pleasure of the Board.

A member's position on the Board shall become vacant upon his or her death, resignation, or removal by the Board of Supervisors. In the case of such a vacancy, the Board shall appoint a successor to fill the unexpired term.

The Board of Supervisors policy of limiting consecutive terms of office does not apply to this Board, per Ordinance No. 90-0086, Section 3.100.030(B).

## **COMPENSATION**

\$25 per meeting for each meeting attended, not to exceed twenty meetings in any calendar year.

## **MEETINGS**

Third Thursday of each month at 2:00 p.m., at the community Building in Burton Chase Park at 13650 Mindanao Way, Marina del Rey, 90292.

## **DUTIES**

The Design Control Board (DCB) ensures that all redevelopment, renovations and any exterior modifications are in accordance with the standards for Marina del Rey. In 1961, the Board of Supervisors approved and adopted the original Specifications and Minimum Standards of Architectural Treatment and Constructions, in which the DCB was defined as "the Board appointed by the Board of Supervisors to review and approve the architectural design and arrangement of facilities constructed in Marina del Rey."

This was reiterated in the Los Angeles County Local Coastal Program (LCP), certified in February 1996 by the California Coastal Commission, that the DCB, appointed by the Board of Supervisors, shall review all new development proposals, including renovations, for consistency with the manual, Specifications and Minimum Standards of Architectural Treatment and Construction and the certified LCP, including the identity and accessibility of the Marina as a public boating and recreational facility, and shall recommend such modifications to the design as they deem appropriate. Such review shall be completed prior to any application for development being submitted to the Department of Regional Planning for case processing.
